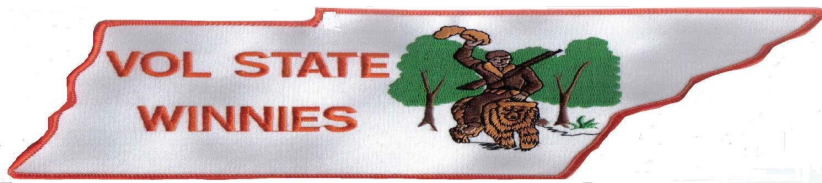

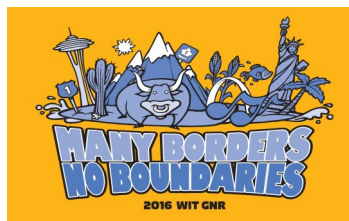

THEY'RE OUT THERE!!!



Since October 2015, Winnebago has sold 104 new coaches in Tennessee. Only 32 of the new owners have joined WIT and of those who have joined WIT, 8 have joined VSW and/or one of our chapters.

As you travel throughout the year, be on the lookout for Winnebago and Country Coach motorhomes with Tennessee tags. Talk to them and let them know how great it is to be in WIT and VSW and the great friends they will have in your local chapters.

FYI, the beginning of 2016, VSW has lost 9 coaches or one more that we have gained.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

As you read this, many of you are on your way to Forest City, IA and Winnebago's Grand National Rally. As usual, VSW and its member chapters will be well represented, albeit hidden at GNR. Of the 26 coaches registered for GNR only 9 will park in the Tennessee State Row. While I understand that it would be inconvenient for those helping with greeting and parking or are affiliated with other special groups to join us on the state row, I am disappointed in the low percentage.

Loss of members continues to be a primary concern. Health problems (the latest Dave Surles), discontentment with Winnebago quality and other reasons continue to diminish our ranks. VSW has lost 9 coaches (18 members) since October, 2015.

Currently, we have 58 coaches in VSW. There are an additional 7 coaches that are members of RTT, 4 that are members of WTT that are not members of VSW. Since members of a Tennessee chapter can attend VSW outings, there really is no advantage for joining the state club--other than it is the club's only source of income.

It's really difficult to put on a state campout and near impossible a state rally on a total income of \$580, plus fees. Our April outing lost \$400.00 and we expect that October will be worse.

I really need your help encouraging current members to stay and in finding new members. There are plenty of potential members out there. Winnebago (and Itasca) continue to sell an average of 12 coaches each month.

FIRST TIME TO GNR?

Some of us will be making our first pilgrimage to Forest City and Winnebago Industries' *Grand National Rally* in July. The anticipation is both exciting and intimidating—1500 motorhomes in one place! So, we thought we would share a few tips that have been given to us by the cadre of VSW members who are fixtures at GNR.

You will be dry camping while at GNR. You will have power and shared water but no sewer connections. Be prepared:

- Empty your holding tanks before entering the campground.
- Make sure your fresh water tank is full before entering the campground.
- Disconnect your toad before entering the campground. There will be a line waiting to be parked. Use this time to disconnect and park your toad
- Purchase *Honey Wagon* tickets at the front gate (as you enter the campgrounds). They are \$25 each. A ticket must be displayed on the road side of your RV no later than 7:00 a.m. the day service is needed.
- Tell the Greeters that you are a *first timer*. Your badge will signify you are a first timer and everyone—especially WIT personnel and members will make sure that you enjoy GNR.
- Bring extra power cables and potable water hoses. Potable water is shared and hoses will be needed to daisy-chain between coaches
- Cars are not allowed in the RV parking areas. Designated parking areas are available on the perimeter of the grounds. Do not attempt to drive within the grounds.
- People movers are free and continuously circle through the grounds. Bicycles, golf carts—but not ATVs—are also allowed.
- Bus service to points outside the campground is available. Schedules will be in your Rally Program.
- Register early for any events or activities to make sure you can get in or participate. This also applies to any service work you may want done.
- The pace will be frenetic—too much to see, too much to do—so plan your time before you get there.
- Read your March/April and May/June WIT Club News thoroughly. They are an excellent source of information and schedules. Also, the website, www.witclub.com allows you to register for classes and events.

If you have questions or concerns, ask one of the seasoned veterans or let us know and we will attempt to answer your questions.
